KITCHEN EXCAVATION PROJECT

- 1. Excavate your kitchen trash basket at home this week (7 levels). If possible, begin with a full trash basket. Look down into the basket, take a picture, and write down everything you can see by just looking. This will be Level 1 and set them aside. Now look into the basket again. Write down what you can see now, take a picture. This will be level 2. Remove these object and set them aside. Continue recording, labeling, taking pictures of each layer and removing layers until the basket is empty (7 levels).
- 2. Use the LOG to make a list of all written sources that you discovered in the trash basket. If the item has any kind of a date on it, record the date beside the item.
- 3. Use the LOG to make a list of all non-written sources discovered in the trash.

Why am I doing this project? "A culture's trash is more than just waste. The trash of ancient and older civilizations uncovered by <u>archaeologists</u> helps us learn more about their cultures. In the same manner, the trash in modern landfills provides just as much insight into our modern cultures." (UW Garbology Project)

Remember: This is an important homework project and will count as four full homework grades (40 points). Late homework is not accepted for full credit.
