BE ON TIME

<u>Excused Absences</u>: It is the student's responsibility to write "absent-excused" in the upper left hand corner of the paper if it is turned in late due to an excused absence.


<u>DBQ's (Document-Based Questions)</u> <u>Essays</u>. Your student will be using primary sources to write one to two historical essays this school year.

Supplies
